Title of project: Bike It

Brief summary of project, what pupils did, any external support etc

Braybrook Primary School have been involved in the Sustrans Bike it project for a number of years. This has led to a positive impact on the number of children travelling to school either by bike or scooter.

The Bike It crew have worked with the Bike It officer from Sustrans to make biking fun at Braybrook and school is now Biketastic. They have taken part in a range of workshops and competitions and in particular have won The Big Pedal a number of times. Last year their prize was a visit from a BMX champion who put on a show and taught Year 4 how to do some tricks. The pupils have learnt how to do basic checks n their bikes to make sure they are safe to ride.

The Bike Crew hold a number of bike themed events throughout the year, for example during the Tour de France they held a Design a Cycle Jersey competition which received an overwhelming number of entries.

The Golden Lock regularly makes an appearance on a random bike or scooter. The lucky recipient receives a prize from the mystery bag. At the end of last academic year they were taking part in a bike and scooter count competition, counting the number of bikes and scooters every single lunchtime.

The bike sheds at Braybrook are always over half full and in the summer they are overflowing.
