Title of project: Healthy Tuck Shop

Brief summary of project, what pupils did, any external support etc

The Eco Council at St Botolph's set up and run a healthy tuck shop for Key Stage 2 pupils at break time. They provide healthy affordable snacks for the pupils which allow them to concentrate better in lessons before lunch.

Prior to setting up the tuck shop the pupils consulted with parents, pupils and teachers to decide how the tuck shop should be run and what products to stock.

They sell mainly fruit and cereal bars and some cartons of juice. To avoid the pupils handling money they use a token system. Each Friday pupils can purchase 10 tokens for £1.50 and they use these to pay for items from the tuck shop.

At the end of each breacktime the pupils record how much stock they have left.
